Proposers and seconders are reminded that membership is by invitation of the Committee, and that to protect the character of ASCHB, the Constitution requires (a) that persons invited shall be professionally engaged in work related to the conservation of historic buildings and monuments, and (b) that invitations shall not normally be issued to those having a commercial interest in conservation.

In cases where exceptions are proposed, those submitting names to the Committee may be asked to justify their proposal by expressing in a covering letter:

- a clear evidence that the person proposed would contribute positively to the aims and objects of the Association. This could be provided by a good publications record or other evidence of a distinctive or active contribution to the world of conservation.
- b a firm assurance that the person proposed is unlikely to use membership for commercial advancement or influence. Membership of a body which requires an ethical declaration, such as UKIC, could demonstrate this, while the Committee may consider in addition the size of any firm or company with which the person proposed is associated, its financial form and style of management, and any links with a parent company.

On accepting the Committee's invitation to membership of ASCHB, the person proposed will be required to sign an undertaking that he or she will not use membership for commercial advancement or influence.

The Committee reserves the right to rescind invitations in case of abuse.
