This index has been divided into two parts, an index of persons (which includes professional partnerships) and a general index. Volume numbers are indicated by bold figures. Titles of articles are indicated by inverted commas, of books and journals by italics. A reference in the form '5 24-30' indicates a continuous reference to the subject of the entry; '5 24, 25" or '5 24-30 passim' indicates separate references on each page shown. References which include or consist of illustrations are indicated with an 'i' after the page number, except in Volume 1, where illustrations are referred to by their figure number preceded by an 'f'. In the index of persons, a few corrections of names in the text and additions of first names or initials have

been made in order to assist the user; only the more significant errors are noted as such.

In Volume 1 references are to the pages or figures in the reprint of 1979; the original printing was unpaginated with a large number of blank pages which were eliminated in the reprint, but the figure numbers are the same. For the original version of Volume 1 page numbers should be read as follows:
